Please accept this letter as confirmation that Bill Bennett, Minister of Energy and Mines, the Environmental Assessment Office (EAO) and I have received the Report of Independent Expert Engineering Investigation and Review Panel examining the causes of the dam breach at the Mount Polley Mine (the Mount Polley Report).

EAO has reviewed the Mount Polley Report and has solicited and received submissions pertaining to the Mount Polley Report from Pacific Booker Minerals Inc., as well as from Gitanyow Hereditary Chiefs, Gitxsan Treaty Society and Lake Babine Nation.
