- G. On October 11, 2022, pursuant to Section 17 of the Act (2002), the Chief Executive Assessment Officer referred the Application, the assessment report dated October 7, 2022 and their recommendations to the undersigned dated October 11, 2022.
- H. The undersigned have considered the Application, the summary assessment report, the assessment report and recommendations of the Chief Executive Assessment Officer.

Now Therefore,

We issue this Environmental Assessment Certificate to Tilbury Jetty GP Inc. (the "Holder") for the Project as described in the Certified Project Description (Schedule A), subject to the conditions set out in the Table of Conditions (Schedule B).
