Re: Quarterly Report for 2024 Q2 Pacific Trail Pipelines Project EAC 08-01

Pacific Trail Pipelines Limited Partnership (PTP LP), a wholly owned subsidiary of Enbridge Inc., is pleased to submit this progress report on the Pacific Trail Pipelines Project (Project) for the second quarter of 2024. This progress report is intended to update the Environmental Assessment Office (EAO) in respect of PTP LP's progress implementing the Project commitments in the Environmental Assessment Certificate (E08-01) and Amendment Certificate #2, #3, and #4.

Camps, multi-use sites and accessible areas of the right of way were routinely checked for unauthorized access, vandalism, and erosion throughout the report quarter.

PTP LP continues to meet with Indigenous groups, landowners and tenure holders along the Project route as required.¹ PTP LP will publish public notifications in local newspapers to inform residents, local groups and clubs of construction activities as a revised Project construction schedule becomes clearer.² Notifications have been limited to an as needed basis due to reduced Project activity since the 2017-2018 construction season.

DFO issued two letters of advice stating that their review determined that the Project is unlikely to cause serious harm to fish and that no formal approval is required to proceed with the project in Sections 1 through 5. PTP LP will be reviewing the project with the DFO prior to recommencing construction to ensure the Project will continue to meet regulatory requirements.

Transport Canada has confirmed that under the new Navigation Protection Act no watercourse crossings on the Project route require applications to Transport Canada. Accordingly, Transport Canada has advised that it

has closed its files. This determination addresses commitments 8.71, 12.2 and 12.4.

During the upcoming report quarter, routine checks of multi-use sites and accessible areas of the right of way for unauthorized access, vandalism and erosion will continue. Ongoing environmental monitoring programs will continue in 2024.
