Coyote Hydrogen Project

Fortescue recently completed an evaluation of our global project portfolio, with an aim to prioritize the projects in locations with favorable green energy policies and affordable and reliable renewable energy.

We have focussed our energy project portfolio to include a pipeline of commercially viable projects to carry us forward and meet future demand, while acting in the best interests of our shareholders. With that, we have decided to put on hold our Project Coyote in Prince George until we are able to secure more favorable power pricing and availability.
